In addition, he served as a leader and activist in the Civil Rights Movement as a member of CORE and NAACP.

Lloyd made numerous friends wherever he went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him. He was always a true friend and a devoted family man.

He loved to read and listen to Jazz.
