November 23, 1950 - February 1, 2013

Lloyd Trusty, son of Paul W. and Virgie A. Trusty, was born in Baltimore, Maryland on November 23, 1950 at Johns Hopkins Hospital. He was the middle

child of three sons. He departed this life on February 1, 2013 at the Gilchrist Hospice Center of Greater Baltimore Medical Center.

Lloyd received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from City College of Baltimore in 1968. He continued his education at

the University of Baltimore in the Mt. Royal area of Baltimore City.

Lloyd began his spiritual journey at the Mr. Arat Baptist Church. He kept God in his life by treating everyone as if they counted. He loved his family and friends, always doing a little something to make your day a little better. He never wanted praise, never wanted the spotlight; but was happy for everyone's

accomplishments.

Lloyd was very familiar with work, beginning when he was thirteen years old. His first job was working with a beauty products distributor on the delivery truck; he knew every beauty shop and barber shop in Baltimore. He continued on, working in the family owned filling station until it closed. In July of 1973 he landed a job at Johns Hopkins Hospital as a registrar in the Emergency Department,

where he remained for fourteen years, making many friends along the way.

The physicians and nurses were especially fond of him, because of his vast knowledge of the patients; many he seem to know personally. He went about his job as if it was not a job at all, enjoying his time on the line. He began the last job he would hold in April of 1991 with the Hern-Kirkwood Company in Hanover, Maryland. The company processed food and it was Lloyds' responsibility to cut fruit and vegetables to be packed and shipped to grocery stores. Because of his love for his job and his perfection in doing his job, he became very good at his job; and he was sure to tell everyone about the art of cutting fruit and vegetables. Over the years his job responsibilities took him to other areas of the company and he ended his time there as the quality assurance specialist. Due to illness, he retired from Hern-Kirkwood on August 12, 2012.

He was preceded in death by his mother and father. Lloyd leaves to celebrate his life: two brothers, Paul L. Trusty and Clement Trusty (Lena Smith); one aunt, Chanie Jones of Baltimore, Maryland; one uncle, Willie (Doe) Trusty of Virginia, two sisters-in-law, Deborah Trusty and Lucille (Pinky) Trusty; nieces, Erica and Jannelle Trusty; one nephew, Dante Trusty; a special friend, Diedra; and a host of cousins and loving friends.

Not to be forgotten are special people to Lloyd: his stepmother, Ms. Orelia Trusty and step-sister, Wanda Lessene. Over the last ten years, these two
