He went on to Anna Maria College in Paxton, MA, and graduated in 2005 with a master's degree in Criminal Justice. Lloyd was passionate in pursuing a career in law and legislation. He completed law enforcement training at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center and became a criminal investigator with the government of the District of Columbia Office of Inspector General. Recently, Lloyd's dream job became reality when the FBI accepted him as a special agent. Lloyd loved traveling.
