September 5, 1930 - September 22, 2017

Loreather Baines, daughter of the late Roosevelt Washington Sr. and Emma Washington, was born on September 5, 1930 in Dunnellon, Florida. She departed this life on September 22, 2017 after a lengthy illness.

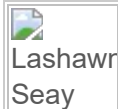
