LORETTA ANNE GOODE, was born to the late Richard Edward Goode and the late Lillian Louise Whittle on September 18, 1950 in South Hill, Virginia, at the age five, her family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland, and she then began her Christian experience at Payne Memorial A.M.E. Church. At that time the pastor was the late Reverend Mitchell. Because of a very serious injury to her right hand at the age of eight; she learned to play the piano and began playing for Sunday school and the summer camp. She completed thirteen years of training from the John Thompson Musical Training Program. She accepted the Holy Ghost at age thirteen, in October of 1963.

Loretta was educated in the Baltimore City School System. She graduated from Eastern High School in 1968. She continued her education receiving several degrees: cooking and Catering, Pharmacy Technician Assistant, Paralegal Assistant, Business Administration Management, with a Bachelor of Science from the University of Baltimore, as well as a Legal and Ethical Studies Master of Science Degree from the University of Baltimore. Loretta Goode also received a Masters of Theology from the full Gospel Bible Institute (Marantha Assemblies) in Coatesville, PA.

Loretta joined the Highway Church of Christ in 1985, where the late Apostle Robert Evans was the pastor. Later the name of the church was changed to Beth-El Temple Church of Christ. She served as a member of the Choir, a

Sunday Teacher, as well as a worker within the Women's Department.

After several years of serious illness, she decided to fully answer the call of God and she began serving at Bountiful Blessing Worship Center, where Bishop Kenneth W. Hill is the founder and pastor. She served as Sunday School Teacher for the Primary Class, and a Bible Class teacher. She later went on to become a Deacon.

She leaves behind: one son, Tyrone Vernon Ward, Jr.; six brothers, John (Blanche), Larry, Butch, Harry (Paulette), Joseph (Cynthia) and Ernest (Linda); and one sister, Avis. She also leaves behind a host of nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, family, friends and church family members.
