



## Loretta Plummer

February 5, 1921 - January 12, 2017

Loretta Plummer was born in Saint James Jamaica on February 5, 1922. She was the second of three children born to Amos Vaughn and Christiana Karr.

Loretta obtained her formal education at the Lottery Primary School, after completing her education she entered the care giving occupation. She later met and married Cyril Plummer, who is now deceased. The union produced 9 children. Her children were her pride and joy and she relished the responsibility. Sister Plummer made raising her children, to be God fearing and hard working individuals, her highest priority and her full time occupation.

Loretta accepted the Seventh Day Adventist message in 1958 and joined the Lottery Seventh Day Adventist Church. Sister Plummer was a firm believer in christian education; she insisted upon insuring that her four youngest children received a Christian education. With the support and assistance of her husband, they each attended Harrison Memorial High School, a Seventh Day Adventist school, in Montego Bay, Jamaica.

Loretta immigrated to the United States in 1982. After a short time in Baltimore, MD she settled in South Ozone Park, Queens, New York. Where she worked in health care for over 20 years. She was an active member of the South Ozone Park Seventh Day Adventist Church.

In 2014 Sister Plummer retired and moved to Baltimore in order to be closer to her stateside children. She remained a faithful Seventh Day Adventist until her passing on January 12, 2017.

Sister Plummer is resting in the Lord and waiting for her call on that great resurrection morning. She is survived by 4 Children, Enid James, Nevelle, Hugh, Wesley and Delroy Plummer, and a host of grand children, great grandchildren, and great-great grandchildren.
