On January 7, 1932, a little girl named Lorraine Smith made her debut. She was born in the county of Marlboro, township of Bennettsville, South Carolina, to the late Ollie Mae Smith (Douglas) and Malcolm Smith. Lorraine was welcomed into the world by her brother, Marion, and was later blessed with a baby sister, Maxcine.

Lorraine left South Carolina for Maryland at an early age, and was baptized at the Fountain Baptist Church. She was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System, and graduated from Carver Technical High School. Immediately following graduation, Lorraine entered the workforce. She used her talents to advance her career from entry level employee to senior leadership until her retirement in 1993.

Although Lorraine held her 40 years of service in high esteem, there was one job that she valued much, much more. Mothering her 3 children was her favorite, and most valued accomplishment. Born from her union with the late Levi Peterson, Sr., nothing was more precious to Lorraine than her 3 little angels, Joyce, Levi Jr., and Maurice. Throughout Lorraine's life, family continued to be very important to her. She loved spending time with her children and grandchildren, and always found a way to make them her priority.

When Lorraine wasn't spending time with family, she often explored her passion for collecting antique china and dolls.

On the morning of October 22, 2011, God decided that it was time for his angel to return home. She is now with her beloved son Levi Jr. However, her loving memories will continue in the hearts of her children Joyce Fields and Maurice Peterson- Marilyn; her brother, Marion (Smitty) Smith; sister, Maxcine Thomas (Floyd); great aunt, Atlee Dease; and a host of grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces, and nephews, that will carry her legacy in their hearts forever.
