Lorraine was born in East Baltimore on June 10, 1927 to the late Augustus Doles, Jr and Iola Washington Doles. She was the youngest of six children.

On September 27, 1952, Lorraine was joined in Holy Matrimony to the late Frederick Williams, Jr., who was known affectionately as “Pop Pop.” together they raised eight children- five daughters and three sons. In fact, she loved baseball so much that she named her oldest son, Larry-better known as “Juicy”- after old-time Brooklyn Dodgers star, Larry Darnell.

amazing.
