LOTTIE ADELE EPES STOKES, daughter of the late Lucinda and Buddie Epes, was born in Nottoway County, Virginia on November 3, 1911. She departed this life January 17, 2006 at 6:00 a.m. in the Future Care Center, after a brief illness. Three sisters and three brothers preceded Adele in death. Adele moved to Baltimore at the age of sixteen and completed her high school education at Douglass High night school on Calhoun Street. On completion of her education, Adele did days work until she found employment at the Mount Vernon Society Club. She served as a maid until being promoted to head bartender. Later she was employed by the state at the Spring Grove Hospital where she worked until her retirement in 1974. In 1927 she met and fell in love with the late Levi Stokes. They were united in holy matrimony in 1928. From this union four children were born - Helen (Mona), Leon (Levi Jr.), Ethel (Deceased) and Lucinda (Cindylou). Adele was a life long member of Macedonia Baptist Church. She joined under the leadership of Rev. Daniel Mack and was a member of the Missionary Society, the William P. Hope Choir and the Clayton Chorus. Adele was a willing worker and contributed time and monies to all the workings of the church, with love. Adele's home was the house at the bend in the road, and no matter who came all were welcome. She made numerous friends everywhere she went, and everyone she met loved her. Her favorite words were "thank you." She leaves to remember her with love: two daughters, Helen Remona Paysour and Lucinda Adele Queen; one son, Leon Levi Stokes Jr.; one son-in-law, Ronald Queen; one daughter-
