We still don't remember where we all slept in our tiny home, but there was always enough space, enough food, but most of all, enough love. You know, it took us a while to really understand the love you shared with us. It wasn't because we always agreed with you, and it definitely wasn't because we always obeyed, it was all because of you allowing God to arise and live through you. This love didn't just appear a few weeks ago, it started when you accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Savior when you were a little girl in North Carolina. You often told us how He walked with you, how He talked with you and how He assured

you that you belong to Him. You taught us that it's good to have money, and it's good to have health, but without love we are but sounding brass and tinkling symbols. You brought that same love with you when we moved to Baltimore, MD, where before you sought employment, you sought a church home where we would worship together. For over thirty years, you worked diligently at Central Baptist Church under the pastorate of Dr. Montague Brackett, until God called you to work in a different part of His vineyard for the next ten years of your Christian journey. It was because of your love that you opened up your home where an anointed and powerful ministry, Love alive Ministries worshiped for six months until space became a major issue.
