Lou received her education in the Baltimore City public schools. She graduated from Douglass High School in June, 1950. Upon graduating from high school, she served in the United States Navy as a nursing Assistant until being honorably discharged on July 10, 1953. Lou Accepted Christ at an early age and became an active member of the Mount Zion United Methodist Church under Pastor Franklin. She faithfully served on many committees, choirs, and discipleship groups for over twenty-five years. She enjoyed helping people, cooking, photography, shopping, music, and especially traveling. Lou regularly traveled to Jamaica, went on many cruises, and took several cross-country bus trips. She loved seeing the world and meeting new

people. Lou was a “road scholar” at heart, and she loved to debate and interact with persons from around the world. But most of all, she loved her family and enjoyed having them over for big meals. She especially took great joy in her relationship with her grandchildren, Jennifer and Elliott Saunders, who brought her much happiness.
