Legacy of Love

Louis E. Abrams, Sr., was called to rest with the Lord on the morning of Thursday, February 6, 2020. Louis was born to the late Robert Russell Abrams and Annie Bell Ellis in New Kent, Virginia on November 16, 1936. He was predeceased by his sister Jacquelin Mason and his son, Louis E. Abrams, Jr.

Louis gave his life to Christ at a very early age. He was a devoted man of God. Louis served the Lord many years at New Elam Baptist Church as a Deacon, a Trustee and a renowned vocalist and choir member.

Louis graduated from George W. Watkins where he was not only advanced academically but also completed his welding vocational training. After graduating, he went on to serve in the United States Navy, as a proud military man.

Louis relocated to Philadelphia at an early age. His professional career started at the Philadelphia Naval Yard and he later went on to become a Philadelphia Police Officer. Louis retired from the Philadelphia Police Department in 1980. He was also a member of the Fraternal Order of Police for 55 years (1965-2020), and a member of the Guardian Civic League.

Louis believed in justice and being a leader in the African-American community. Hence, he was one of the original five (5) founders of The Concerned Black Men of Philadelphia, now an international organization. Louis returned to his hometown, New Kent, VA in 1980 with his wife Lillian and his daughters, Barbara and Jackie.

He continued to have an impact on his family and community upon his return as a member of the Civic League, the New Kent Planning Commission and other community organizations.

Among his many attributes, he was an entrepreneur who owned and operated Abrams Welding Service.

Louis, Lou, Abe, Abrams was one who was outspoken and known for his sense of humor. He'd leave everyone laughing even after just infuriating you. He was also a devoted son, a provider for his family and one who loved life.

Louis was predeceased by his devoted wife, Lillian Abrams and leaves to cherish his memories: mother, Annie Bell Ellis; 7 daughters, Barbara M. Blunt (Jerry), Jacquelyn L. Ball (Reuben), Veronica Abrams, Annise R. Abrams, Juanita McWhite (Alonza), Diane Moore (Lewis), and Carol Taylor; 3 sisters, Virginia Johnson, Delores Payne and Barbara Abrams-Wallace (Woodford); brother, Russell O. Abrams (Ann); 2 sisters-in-law, Mary Davis (Herbert) and Juanita Fisher; brother-in-law, Ernest E. Jones (Denise Rae); 17 grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren, 6 great great-grandchildren; and a host of other family members and friends.
