Louis Bond, son of the late Daniel and Rosie Cherry Bond, was born April 30, 1935 in Windsor, North Carolina. He departed this life on May 17, 2004 after a short illness. Louis, who was affectionately called DR. OOZE by family and friends, received his education at W.S. Etheridge High School in Bertie County, North Carolina. Upon completion of his education he moved to Baltimore. Shortly after arriving in Baltimore he was drafted in the armed forces.
