Louis received his formal education in Baltimore grade schools and subsequently at Frederick Douglass Senior High School. He worked in several drug stores during his early life, among these were Reads and Pen-Dol. Louis was very friendly and was known for his easygoing temperament. On January 14, 1943, Louis entered active military service through the draft. He subsequently was sent to Texas, where the 581st Engineer Dump Truck Company was formed. Most of Louis active duty service, both Stateside and Abroad, was with the 581st Engineer Dump Truck Company. Louis served in the United States, Europe and Africa. He was discharged on February 8, 1946. Louis attained the rank of Corporal and was a credit to his country. Louis was never married, nor did he have any children. He was a friend to everyone that he met during his lifetime. He will be sorely missed. Some of Louis favorite pastimes included playing the piano and the recorder flute. He also enjoyed chess and other games of strategy. Louis had lively sense of humor and would often tell those "How Sharp Are You" genre of jokes.
