Louise Jackson was born on November 18, 1926, to the late Eddie and Frances Harris of Kershaw, South Carolina. She departed this life after a brief illness on Sunday, October 23, 2011.

Louise grew-up in Kershaw, South Carolina, where she met and married her childhood sweetheart, McKinley Jackson on July 22, 1945. Out of the sixty-five union, they raised (6) children and dedicated their lives to their family, church and community.
