Mrs. Louise Revella Moore was born Louise Revella Carter, July 5, 1926, to the late Elsie Carter in Pennsylvania County, Va. She departed this world on Tuesday, November 24, 2009, suddenly at her home in Richmond, VA. She was preceded in death by her husband, Joseph D. Moore and her daughters Shirley Waller, Catherine Moore and Dorothy Carter. She leaves to cherish her memory one surviving daughter; Dr. Anne Bowers of Dover, Pa, a devoted sister, Minister Bernice (Bert) C. Truesdale, and a beloved brother Paul Carter. She had a gift for dealing with slow developing minds. She will be remembered for the children she nurtured to talk, walk, sit still and behave before there were ever labels such as ADHD or Ritalin. Louise knew how to love a child out of a disorder. Louise was a long time volunteer with Girl Scouts of America. Louise was a co-leader with her daughter Shirley Waller. Upon the death of her youngest daughter Shirley in 1996, she returned to

Virginia, choosing to live in Richmond and to be close to her sister and daughter. This, once again, put her close to one of her favorite places, The James River. She loved fishing. This was second only to her other passion, slots. Atlantic City was her favorite weekend getaway. Louise was also a giver, always trying her best to do for anyone with a need within her scope. Her last act of kindness occurred within minutes of her death as she made sure that her family had everything needed to prepare Thanksgiving dinner. Giving to others gave her great joy!
