She was an honorary member of Peter's Rock Holiness Church in Anniston, as well as an honorary member of the Church of Deliverance in Baltimore. She was a master seamstress who loved to sew and crochet. She created many clothes, garments, and one of her favorite things to make was lavish curtains. On many summer occasions Louise loved to go to amusement parks with family to swim and ride thrill rides.
