Upon moving here she became a member of Garrison Boulevard United Methodist Church. At the time of her death she was a faithful member of Orchard Park Christian Jubilee Church United Methodist. Lucille was a strong Christian whose faith in God's goodness never wavered throughout her long life on earth.
