Peppe looked forward to the daily treats Lucille would bring him. Lucille was a stylish dresser who always kept her hair beautifully groomed. She had many friends and admirers. Lucille was a member of Memorial Baptist Church, located on Caroline and Preston Streets in Baltimore, MD, where she was baptized. She was a devoted member for many years until she moved to Louisville, KY, to reside with her oldest daughter, Brenda, who lovingly cared for her. After a series of severe strokes, Lucille was admitted to a nursing home in Kentucky in May 2004. Despite the strokes, Lucille remained a cheerful person, smiling at anyone who called her name or crossed her path. On March 8, 2005, Lucille crossed over into

eternity. She decided she needed a change of scenery and accepted a position offered her as a laborer in the Kingdom of God. What a fine worker she'll be!
