February 7, 1920 - July 15, 2025

Lucille Tyler of Gwynn Oak, Maryland, departed this life peacefully in her sleep on July 15, 2025.

Born to Isaiah & Eva (nee Mack) Brunson on February 7, 1920, Lucille was the firstborn of 7 children and attended public school in a one-room schoolhouse in Manning (Clarendon County), South Carolina.

In December 1939, she married Robert James Johnson and welcomed a daughter, Carolyn. In 1941, the family moved to Maryland and in 1942 welcomed a second child, Ernestine. Although their union would not endure, Lucille remained steadfast in her devotion to her children and found spiritual nourishment at Enon Baptist Church. Through faith and perseverance, she realized the dream of becoming a homeowner and bought a house for her family on Windsor Ave.

In May of 1976, Lucille wed Calvin Tyler. Inseparable, they spent their retirement years with family and friends, and indulging their love of travel with several trips and cruises. A devoted Christian, Enon Baptist Church honored Lucille's 75 years of service as being among its longest serving congregation members. Lucille was active in the Missionary Circle, Willing Workers, Gospel Choir, and the Nurses Guild. In 2024, Lucille was recognized at the Mack family reunion as their oldest living family member.

Lucille is preceded in death by her husband, Calvin; and survived by her daughters, Caroline Byrd and Ernestine McDonald; grandchildren (Stephen & Christopher Byrd); great-grandchildren (Brandon & Kristyn Byrd); great-great grandchildren (Bryce Byrd & Giana O'Banion); and a host of adoring cousins, nieces, nephews, and extended family.
