October 2, 1927 - October 6, 2013

LUCINDA VIRGINIA GRANT HAYES, 86, of Baltimore, Maryland went home to be with her Savior, Jesus, on Sunday, October 6, 2013. She was surrounded by her children, grandchildren, and loved ones.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her sisters and brother, her husband (LeRoy Hayes Jr.), her eldest son (Rev. LeRoy Hayes III), and her oldest grandson (Minister Gary L. Hayes Jr.).

Lucinda was born in Charleston, South Carolina on October 2, 1927. She was the sixth child of eight born to Clinton and Earlee Grant, and the last to depart this life.

Lucinda graduated from Allen University, with a teaching degree, in 1950. She married LeRoy Hayes Jr. in Estill, SC on May 20, 1952. In 1954 their firstborn son, LeRoy (Ronnie) Hayes III, was born in Ridgeland, SC. Soon afterwards the family moved to Baltimore, MD.

In 1963, as a guard in the “cottages”, Lucinda began her career at the Women's Correctional Institute in Jessup, MD. As opportunities arose, she was able to use her teaching degree to help inmates achieve their high school equivalency (GED). She received her Master's Degree from Coppin State College in 1973, evidence of her determination to continue to excel in the realm of education.

She retired from Jessup after 30 years of service, but she did not take a hiatus from helping others. She remained active in church (Forest Park Community) giving support to a plethora of Christian organizations, causes, individuals,

and family needs.
