Lucy OdeSSa Cousin, daughter of Elsie Maclin and the late Robert Buie, was born on February 8, 1953 in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life on August 13, 2014 after a lengthy illness. She received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System.

Early in life she gave birth to her daughter, Lisa, and shortly after gave birth to her son Charlie. Not too long after, she met Ivanhoe, who then in 1979 became her husband, Lucy had a love for children which led her to volunteer at Collington Square Elementary School, and she also worked at Oak Crest Village until her illness.

Lucy was known to always have an open door policy whether for food or shelter. In the early 1990s, she became involved in the Mother's Against Violence after losing her only son to gun violence. She became involved with creating the first AIDS/HIV quilt that was created in Baltimore City because of various family members, friends and most importantly her daughter, Lisa, dealing with the illness. Due to her involvement in these organizations, she received multiple awards from various government officials.

In 2008, she relocated to Petersburg, Virginia with the anticipation of her granddaughter coming a year later to attend college. As fate would have it, her hopes and dreams came true. Just because Lucy relocated to Virginia did not stop her from becoming a surrogate to those who needed someone. To know her was to love her.

Lucy was preceded by her children, Charlie and Lisa, her brother, Richard and

Willie and her sister, Marie. She leaves to mourn: her mother, Elsie Maclin; her husband, Ivanhoe (affectionately known as Milton); her sister, Karen and Alicia; her brother, James and Gordon; her only grandchild, Ayanna; her close friends, Lyverne, Shirley, Linda, Margaret and Rosemary; nieces, nephews and a host of other relatives and friends.
