After taking training in automatic data processing, she worked for the State of Maryland as a computer data entry operator. She retired from the state employment in 1983. Upon marrying the late Bernard Benjamin Smith, she became the stepmother of Burma and Kenzie Smith. Lucy and Bernard enjoyed bowling, traveling, and entrepreneurial pursuits. The big interest in Lucy's life was bowling. Her home was filled with trophies she had won at various local and national competitions. Lucy was a long time resident of Rosemont Towers and for many years attended a nearby church, Saint Edwards. While at Rosemont, Lucy became ill and eventually moved to Rock Glen Nursing Home.
