



Luther Willard Jackson

January 30, 1922 - March 21, 2003

Luther W. Jackson was born on January 30, 1922 in Overlea, Maryland, the third child of the late Thomas and Julia Jackson. He was affectionately known as “Jack” to friends and relatives. He received his early education in the public schools of Baltimore City, receiving his high school diploma from the Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in its first graduating class. Luther went on to study at Morgan College. He interrupted his college studies to enter the military service during World War II. Achieving the rank of Sergeant, he was honorably discharged from the Army Air Corps in 1946. He married Lucinda Dean in 1946 and from that union one daughter, Rebecca was born. During these years, he began his long career of government service by working for the U.S. Postal Service. He began working for the Aberdeen Proving Ground in 1953 and retired from there in December of 1979. During his tenure of service at Aberdeen, he was very proud of his numerous awards for outstanding service. Luther was confirmed at the Historic Saint Thomas Episcopal Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on May of 1935. He transferred his membership to Saint James of Lafayette Square where he received a plaque commemorating 50 years of confirmation. While at Saint James, he was a devoted and untiring member of the outreach committee until his health made his ability to volunteer impossible. During his spare time, “Jack” enjoyed bowling and playing pinochle. He belonged to a bowling league in Woodlawn, Maryland. Until failing health hindered his participation. Luther was an enthusiastic member of the Pinochle Club at the Forest Park

Senior Center. "Jack" made numerous friends wherever he went and will be seriously missed by everyone who knew him. He leaves to mourn: his daughter, Rebecca J. Warren; her husband, Jesse Warren; his granddaughter, Jennifer Warren; his niece, Valarie Dean his dear friend, Constance Watters; his very special Mikayla Watters; a sister-in-law, and other relatives and friends.
