



## Mabel Elmira Jones

April 1, 1909 - August 6, 2006

Quietly on the afternoon of August 6, 2006, MABEL ELMIRA (FINLEY) JONES was called home to be with her Lord. She was born to the late Laura and William Finley on April 1, 1909 in Holland, GA. Her parents and nine siblings preceded her in death. She received her education in Chattanooga County, GA with the dream of becoming a nurse. She met and married Walter Jones, Sr. and from this union four children were born: Mary, Walter Jr., Laura and Garland. Two of the children are deceased. While living in Georgia, she was affiliated with the A.M.E. Zion church where she held various positions. She was also the town midwife. In 1944, the family moved to Baltimore, MD (Holabird Homes) where she became a member of the Pennsylvania Avenue A.M.E. Zion Church. She later joined First Christian Community Baptist Church where she served faithfully until her illness (December 24, 2005). She has held various positions such as Financial Secretary, Chairperson of Trustee Board, Sick Recorder, Senior Choir member, and Mother of the Church. She was known to some as Mother Jones, but affectionately known as "Nanny" to her family and others. She always gave God the praise, served her church and tended to her family. Nanny was a very busy and creative person with her crocheting, gardening and cooking. Her specialty was her lemon meringue pies. She leaves to continue her legacy: two children, Walter Jr. and Laura Jacquelyn; thirteen grandchildren, Ricky, Michael, Robin, Shirl, Tyrone, Valerie, Walter III, Kellie, Sandy, Pamela, Resha, Wesley Sr., and Russ; thirteen great-grandchildren, twelve great-great-grandchildren, two daughters-

in-law, one brother-in-law, three sisters-in-law, seven nieces, four nephews, nine godchildren, a host of adoptive children and everyone at First Christian Community Baptist Church. Nanny also had four very devoted caregivers who took great care of her until the end: Edna Jones, Sandra Wicks, Cheryl Jones-McCottry, and Cheryl Taylor.
