MACIO FACON, a.k.a Jimmy Murray was born on May 7, 1919 in Red Springs, North Carolina. He was the third eldest son of John T. and Lillie Mae Murray. He departed this life on December 15, 2011 in Union Memorial Hospital.

Macio started working at a very early age, allowing very little time for school and learning. He moved to Baltimore, Maryland in the 1940s. He had no fear of hard work. He used his common sense and learned many different trades. Coal man, Ice man, Auto Mechanic, but his true passion was gardening. He loved planting grass flowers and trees. His greatest joy was watching his seeds grow.
