January 28, 1933 - July 18, 2020

Overseer Maebell Nettles, daughter of the late Willie Moses Sr. and Emma Scippio-Moses, was born on January 28, 1933. She entered into eternal rest on July 18, 2020, after a strong battle with her illness. She was born and raised in Darlington, South Carolina and received her education in Darlington County Public School System.

Overseer Nettles was affectionately known as "Sweet", a name given to her by her grandparents. Her husband also called her "Sweet". Later, her nieces and nephews would come to call her, "Anna Sweet."

At an early age she was baptized in Jesus name and received the gift of the Holy Ghost. At that time, she was under the leadership of the late Bishop Lloyd Swaringer Sr., of Greater Gethesemane Church of Jesus Christ of Darlington, SC.

Maebell met and married the late Frank Nettles Sr. From this union, six lovely children were born: Geneva, Frank Jr., Jerome (Tyrone), Gloria, Cynthia and Kimberly.

Maebell and Frank relocated to Baltimore, MD, where she joined the Mt. Zion Apostolic Church under the leadership of Bishop E.A. Magnum, where she served faithfully. She later joined The Apostolic Church of Jesus Christ under

the leadership of the late Bishop Alfred Wallace Sr. where she served in various capacities in the ministry, including President of the Choir. Through her faithfulness, she was elevated to the office of Evangelist while under Bishop Wallace's leadership.

After many years of service, the Lord led her to begin her own ministry, The Mount Sinai Holiness Church of God. In 1973, they moved to it's first location at 1717 W. Mulberry St. Pastor Nettles held many street services and through her anointed ministry and street services many souls were saved, healed and delivered.

The membership grew and years later the Lord led and blessed them to purchase a larger sanctuary located at 3069 Spaulding Avenue. While at Spaulding Avenue, the Lord blessed Pastor Nettles to be able to resign from her position at BBL to fully commit to her ministry and become a full time pastor. She pastored at this location for many years. Mt. Sinai Holiness Church became a pillar of the community. For many years, Pastor Nettles and he Mt. Siani congregation would give out food baskets during the holiday seasons. Pastor Nettles loved serving God's people as she preached and taught the word of God. She was known for the pharas, "Ain't the Man Alright." She pastored and mentored many people of the community. As the church continued to grow, the Lord blessed them to move to a new edifice located at 4423 Pimlico Road.

After 35 years of pastoring, she made the decision to turn the church over to her grandson, Pastor Damion Hunger in 2006. He was officially installed as the New Senior Pastor in 2008. She continued serving as Overseer at New Generation Christian Center. A few years later, her grandson Pastor Andre Nance began New Mt. Sinai Ministries, in which she supported. Overseer Nettles was very proud of her family She always loved and supported all of her children and grandchildren all of her life. She also dearly loved the saints

that God blessed her to Pastor at Mt. Sinai Holiness Church.

Overseer Nettles "Sweet" was a very caring and devoted wife and mother. She enjoyed fishing, cooking, traveling and reading the bible. Overseer enjoyed family vacations, relaxing, laughing, dining and bonding with her family. She also really enjoyed shopping and fancy clothes, which she wore like the Queen she was. Every suit had to have a hat, shoes, purse and scarf to match. You knew when Overseer was in the room, as she was always dressed elegantly and had a big warm smile on her face as she greeted everyone. She was indeed a great dresser, a Woman of Class and she loved people!

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Frank Nettles Sr.; two children, Gloria Nettles and Jerome (Tyrone) Nettles; her great-grandson, Gabriel Nance; one brother, Willie Moses Jr. and two sisters, Emma Robinson and Alma Johnson.

She leaves to cherish her memory, three daughters, Geneva Huger, Cynthia Nance and Kimberly (Hughie) Martin; one son, Frank Nettles Jr.; ten grandchildren, sixteen great grandchildren, all of Baltimore, MD; her best friend Evangelist Emma Thomas, and a host of relatives and friends.
