Some of her other memberships included AEANA, Northwestern District Citizens Police Academy, East Baltimore Women's Health Project; and she was the organizer for the first Fennell Family Reunion. Mae is survived by: her husband, Thomas; children, Carolyn, Vanstory, Thomas II and Sheila; along with two adopted children by the names of Min. Leroy and Mary Coates; one brother, Linwood Watson of Laurel, Maryland; one sister, Queenie Smith of Norfolk, Virginia (two sisters, Alberta Holmes and Fannie Olds and one brother William Smith preceded her
