(LOL) Grandma Harris always had a story to tell, and she gave very good advice. I enjoyed listening to her talk about her trips. She always had to feed us, and I enjoyed that also. (LOL) Your Grandmother always made me feel at home. I loved the fact that she would allow us to do things that our parents would not, we could tell her things that we would not dare tell our parents; she would make us feel real grown up and from a child’s perspective that made her the coolest grandmother ever!!!!!!!!!!!! Michele I will always remember your grandmother’s beautiful smile. Your grandmother had a smile that could light up a room, and boy! Oh boy! she could dress. She was truly a DIVA! I hope it comforts you to know that she was one of you biggest fans, and she was so very proud of you. Girl, don’t worry because we will all meet again. “ I can hardly believe that it was 1979 when I met Mrs. Harris. We worked together in the Eye Clinic at Constant Care Community Health Center, now named Total Health. You know that she was one of the first Black EPSDT Vision and Hearing testers in the State of Maryland. She worked at the clinic soon after it's inception on Edmondson Avenue. She then on to Mondawmin (where we met) and then ended her career at the Division Street site. I hated that Mrs. Harris retired, but the administration was dealing unfairly by stripping personnel of their senoirity and some benefits. Even after she retired, Mrs. Harris worked with me at the Maryland House of Corrections. We provided eye examinations to inmates, from across the state of Maryland. It was my pleasure to work with Mrs. Harris and to become her friend. I think our friendship (which she would often tell people was the envy of our coworkers)really started after we battled over the use of a stool! Mrs. Harris had increasing complained about fatigue and back ache, at the end of the day. She was required to be very busy and there was little downtime on the job. I suggested that Mrs. Harris roll around on the stool instead of getting up and down and walking. She vehemently opposed. I vehemently proded her, in it's use. WE BATTLED!!! Two Strong Willed Black Women...need I say more! After a while, you could see her inching across the floor on the stool. The first time I saw her fly across the room unconsciously and our eye met, we laughed and laughed and laughed! The tug of war really bonded us! Though out the years, we would go for months without talking, but we would just pick up where we left off... talking for hours at a time. We talked about everything and everybody!
