After serving his country and receiving an Honorable Discharge; Major returned to college where he received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Biology from Morgan State University.

Major's main career was a Medical Lab Technologist and he worked several hospitals throughout his career, including Anne Arundel General Hospital in Annapolis, Greater Baltimore Medical Center(GBMC) and Union Memorial Hospital in Baltimore.
