Malcolm Elmo Belfrom Sr. was born on January 25, 1927, in New York City to Mary Myers and Philip Belfrom. He graduated high school and in 1945 enlisted in the military. He served in the United States Navy from 1945 until 1948. He received an honorable discharge.

Malcolm worked in Manhattan's garment district until he became a New York City Transit Authority bus operator. He worked for twenty-nine years before retiring in 1992. He always wanted to become a pilot. To fulfill his passion, he took aviation lessons. After numerous hours of training, he stopped short of obtaining his license.
