Malvin McLinza Brown, son of the late Elvin and Carrie Brown, was born on December 6, 1929, in Vaughn, North Carolina. He received his early education in North Carolina where he was active in sports. Malvin served in both the United States Army and Navy. He was a veteran of the Korean Conflict. On July 15, 1975 Malvin married his present wife Verna. Malvin was the father of three sons; born to a previous marriage to Betty Knight Brown. When he and Verna were joined in matrimony three children were added to Malvin's family. When the Charity Community Church of God opened in 1965 Malvin began visiting. Later he joined and was an active member of the Usher Board until, in failing health, he was no longer able to serve. Malvin's innate thirst for knowledge and adventure lead him to attend several schools before receiving a bachelor's degree from Antioch University in Baltimore Maryland. After graduation, he was employed by the Housing Authority of Baltimore City. His work there was a time where he advocated for the rights of the disenfranchised. He served on committees and boards during his tenure. Malvin continued work for the betterment of others, even after he retired. Malvin kept in touch with family and friends; this is a memory that all will continue to share. Malvin enjoyed travel and he was never too busy to travel across town or across state lines to inquire about the welfare of others. Malvin never forgot his heritage and worshipped as often as he could in the church of his youth, Greater Ashley Chapel Baptist Church, Vaughn, North Carolina. Malvin leaves his loving wife, Verna Brown, three sons, Malvin Brown II,

William Brown, and Stanley Brown – all of Baltimore, Maryland; three children that he loved as he did their mother, three sisters, Maude Brown, Celesta Brown, and Pollie Del Pino – all of Baltimore, Maryland; one brother and sister-in-law, Elder Elvin and Laceria Brown of Vaughn, North Carolina; five grandchildren, twelve great-grandchildren, and host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
