She sent her girls to Sunday school and every Sunday they watched Mamie sing her heart out on the choir. Mamie was always answering the call of need,

raising her two grandchildren Latrice and Terrance and taking care of her husband and several of her sisters and brothers while they were terminally ill and is survived by only two of the 12, Elizabeth Brown and William Green.
