Mamie Johnson, daughter of the late Sam and Lillie Weatherspoon was born in Florence, South Carolina on October 9, 1919. She departed this life quietly on March 26, 2005 at 3:10 p.m. Mamie spent her earlier life in South Carolina where she attended public school. She came to Baltimore in the late 1930's and was employed by the State of Maryland at Spring Grove Hospital working with mentally retarded individuals for over thirty years. Mamie loved cooking big dinners for her family and neighbors and she gave more than she received. In 1961, she married the late Joseph P. Johnson and from this union was born the late Regina Johnson. Jeannie, as she was affectionately known, preceded her mother in death on August 11, 1994 leaving behind one son, Ricky, who Mamie raised. Mamie gave her life to Christ at an early age. She joined the Miracle Tabernacle of God in the early days of the church when they were located on Madison St. Under the leadership of the late Pastor and Founder, Elder John Brown, Sr., she was known as one of the church's "prayer warriors." Sister Johnson's favorite song was "One Day at a Time." When declining health prevented her from attending church, she served in an advisory capacity, instructing the members on utilizing flea markets as a means of fundraising, based on her experience in that area. She loved her church and when the members visited, she always inspired them by talking about the many things that God had done for her. She leaves to cherish her memory: daughter, Lillie Mae Woodson; five grandchildren, Sandra Johnson, Chauncey, Joyce and Eric Woodson and Ricardo Grimmatt; two great-

grandchildren, Kiedra Johnson and Kala Joi Nelson; two stepsons, Renard Fernandez and Richard Mahoney; a devoted son-in-law, George Woodson; and a host of other family and friends.
