Her favorite hobbies were sewing and crocheting. Once, she even made curtains for her bathroom from one of her favorite evening gowns. During her life she belonged to the Revelers Social Club and served several offices within the club. She was briefly employed by both the Barn and Greenway Restaurants in Glen Burnie. She was a member of Holy Trinity Catholic Church for approximately 30 years. Mamie loved to wake everyone up each morning playing her spiritual music and her favorite scripture was John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son,
