MAMIE LEE STOKES, daughter of the late Rosevelt McCullum and Amie Daniels, was born on December 10, 1942. She departed this life on September 15, 2014 after a lengthy illness

She received her education at Harvey Johnson High School in Baltimore, Maryland. Her employment history began with her working as a private duty nurse; moving on to being a line representative at Doxsee Food Company and the University of Maryland; and later moving on to become a tow motor operator at Berry Plastics, from which she retired.
