Marcus had a very close relationship with his brother, Du’Shawn and would do anything for his brother regardless of the circumstances. He was respectable, caring and considerate of all. His grandmother Mrs. Rouse “Ma” is the one person he had a unique relationship with and loved her unconditionally. Whenever his grandmother got on his nerves he would always say to her “you are out of order.”

Marcus was a laid back type of guy and never worried or complained about

anything in spite of his battle with Leukemia. Regardless of how he was feeling, Marcus never allowed his illness to hinder his relationship with his family and many friends. Marcus kept a smile on his face whether or not he was in pain. He had a good relationship with many doctors and nurses at Sinai Hospital, where he received outstanding treatment for his illness. He had a special bond and relationship with many doctors and nurses, Ms. Bonnie, Ms. Joan, “ adopted white mother Sharon”, and “Aunt Christie.” He always managed to give the nurses at the Hematology Clinic a hard way to go by being on his cell phone while being examined and rushing the nurses to discharged him to go home. Marcus was just that type of guy.

On Tuesday, November 9, 2010 the Golden Gates of Heaven open for Marcus after battling Leukemia for six years. Rest now Marcus, your battle is over, you will live in the hearts of all who loved you and you know who we are, we will miss you deeply.
