May 30, 1935 - May 8, 2020

Margaret Elizabeth Hazel was born on May 30, 1935 in Durham, North Carolina, to the late William H. Brame and Lodister Hazel. She was the youngest of four children—two brothers, Raymond (“Snook”) and Lewis Anderson, and one sister, Willie Mae Thompson. All of her siblings preceded her in death. Margaret was educated at Hillside High School in Durham in 1953. After high school she briefly attended Freeman Hospital School of Nursing in Washington, DC. However, she returned home to attend what is now known as North Carolina Central University, where she obtained a degree in education in 1957. Margaret moved to Baltimore to further her education. She received a master’s degree in Education from what is now known as Coppin State University. Margaret taught in the Baltimore City Public School System as a Special Education teacher for over 30 years and retired in 1996. Because of her passion for teaching, she continued to teach as a substitute teacher in the after-school program at Rognel Height Elementary/Middle School. She even served as a volunteer with the Youth 2 the Kingdom (Y2K) after-school Bible Club. Margaret met and fell in love with the late Earnest T. Allen. In 1984 she adopted two children who were the loves of her life—Sheray Maria and Jerome Leon Allen. Mothering became natural for Margaret. She gave her life to Christ at an early age in North Carolina. When she moved to Baltimore she joined Gospel Tabernacle Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Rev. Dr. Edgar L. Reid. Having the heart of a servant, she became a devoted member and served faithfully on several ministries throughout her years at

The Tab. She enjoyed singing with the Voices of the Tabernacle and the Mass Choir. She taught Sunday School, chaperoned for the Baptist Congress of Christian Education, a part of the Youth Advisory Ministry. She taught as a teacher in the GTBC Summer Day Camp, a member of the Culinary Ministry, the Diamonds Senior Ministry and served as president of the Bulletin Board Ministry. Margaret was a kind, hardworking and loving person and shared her many talents with everyone who crossed her path. Her stern demeanor could readily change with a sweet word or smile. Some of her hobbies included cooking, crossword puzzles, reading and playing scrabble. Margaret loved to cook. Her macaroni and cheese was the bomb. That dish and her seven-up cake would make you salivate for more. Red Lobster was her favorite restaurant, because she loved dining out and eating seafood. She made numerous friends along her life's journey and will be sincerely missed by all who had the pleasure of meeting her.
