MARGARET HELENA GEIGER, the daughter of Daniel Clark and Lillian Streams was born December 18, 1922 and departed this life on April 20th, 2013.

She attended Baltimore City Public School. Known as “Snootie” in her early years she was the second oldest of four siblings. They all preceded her in death.

While working at a restaurant in Sparrows Point in 1946, she met Otis Geiger and married him two weeks later. As a wife and mother, Margaret and Otis raised and cared for their family for 64 years until his passing in 2010.

In the old neighborhood everyone knew her. She was known for being a shoulder to cry on, a provider of wisdom and a problem solver. But most of all she loved kids. She had a fondness for young struggling mothers, evident by the number of young mothers she provided temporary shelter to. The Geiger house was always full of kids because of her willingness to provide after school childcare for the working mothers in the neighborhood. Her love for children transcended from the neighborhood to the children in the family. Aunt Margaret cared for generations of children throughout her family.

She taught her children to look out for and take care of one another and

taught them well. In her later years, beset with Alzheimer's disease, she transitioned from this life at home being cared for by her children.
