MARGARET GREEN, third daughter of the late Sandy Sr. (Pap-Pap) and Estelle Wilson, was born on April 25, 1923 in Honey Hill South Carolina. Resa, as she was affectionately called, departed this life on Tuesday, March 19, 2013 peacefully in her sleep, only six weeks shy on her 90th birthday.

After the death of mother, Pap-Pap married Rebecca Warner. From this union, Resa gained eleven additional siblings. Resa was preceded in death by six of them: Elese, Roberta, Sam, Henry, Earmener and Rosa.

Resa received her early education in the Berkeley County Public School System in South Carolina and completed her education at Paul Laurence Dunbar Jr. High School in Baltimore, Maryland.

In 1941, Resa married Isaac Loyal. Together they had two sons, Leviticus (Jeff) and Robert Lee. Robert Lee also preceded her in death.

In 1954, Resa married her childhood friend, James McNeil Green. From this union son was born,
Edwin.

Resa accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior at an early age. She joined Waters A. M. E. Church under the leadership of Reverend W. B.

Nash. She was a faithful member and sang on the church choir for more than thirty years until her health prevented her from doing so. Her favorite songs were "I Need Thee Every Hour" and "The Solid Rock." Resa loved to sing and hum her favorite hymns. The family takes comfort in the belief that she herself is in eternal rest.

Resa was employed as a dietary aid at Johns Hopkins Hospital and later became a nurses' assistant. She retired from Hopkins in 1974 after more than thirty years of service.
