February 5, 1917 - March 20, 2006

MARGARET MOZELLE HAGANS SMITH was the youngest of three children born to the late Bert and Chanie Virginia Hagans. Margaret was born on February 5, 1917, in Wilson, North Carolina. She ascended peacefully into God's Kingdom on Monday, March 20, 2006, after a lengthy illness. Margaret began her formal education in the public schools of Wilson, North Carolina. At an early age, her family relocated to Baltimore, Maryland, where she excelled academically. Margaret graduated with honors from Douglass High School in 1934. Margaret was later employed by Baltimore City Public Schools. She became the first licensed female engineer and worked as an inspector of facilities. She eventually retired after twenty years as the supervisor of school inspections for Baltimore City. Jesus Christ was always the center of Margaret's life. At the age of six, she and her mother became original members of The Church of God as it was being founded in Baltimore in 1924. She remained very actively involved with the church until her death. It was at church where she met, and later married, the true love of her life, Sewall Smith, Sr. They were joined in Holy Matrimony on December 23, 1934. From this union, eight children were born: four sons and four daughters. Margaret was truly a dedicated wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She was the matriarchal crowning jewel of her family and will be greatly missed. Margaret was preceded in death by her loving husband Sewall, daughter Carolyn and son Samuel.
