She attended Richmond Public Schools graduating with the Maggie L. Walker class of 1946. While she was young, she joined Sharon Baptist Church and became active in several organizations of the church. She was a member of the A. S. Thomas Choir, the Hospitality Committee, and the Flower Club.

She met and married Ellis C. Howard, Sr. and from this union she had two children. She later remarried Toney Hinton and relocated to Raleigh, North Carolina. After a period of time the family returned to Richmond.

Margaret worked for several years at the National Guard of Virginia. Later she retired in 1988 from Westminster Canterbury with 17 years of service.
