



## Margaret Louise Buster

June 10, 1918 - June 25, 2009

MARGARET MITCHELL BUSTER was born in Salisbury, North Carolina on June 10, 1918 to the late Lewis and Mary Hargrave. She departed this life on June 25, 2009. Margaret accepted Christ at an early age and became a member of the First Calvary Baptist Church in Salisbury, North Carolina. She joined Berea Temple Seventh-Day Adventist Church in 1952. Margaret was a deaconess, usher, secretary of the pulpit committee and treasury room worker. She worked for several years with Sister Exum, Naomi White, Jessie Reid and her husband Joseph Buster at the Dorcas Center. She also worked with Milton Thomas on the restoration of Berea Temple Church. Margaret was the president of the Bykota Club for nine years, King's Daughters Secretary and member of the Fifty-Plus Club. She was a great supporter of Baltimore Junior Academy and Berea Temple Church. Margaret was educated in the Salisbury, North Carolina school system. She was employed for four years at the Fitzsimmons Hospital in Denver, Colorado. Margaret worked at Johns Hopkins Hospital for thirty-four years. She worked seventeen years as a nursing assistant and seventeen years as a unit clerk. Margaret retired from Johns Hopkins Hospital. Margaret met and married James Elmer Mitchell in 1940. To this union five children were born: Rosalyn Mitchell Nivens, James D. Mitchell, William Kelsey Mitchell, Franklin Mitchell (deceased) and Anthony Bradford Mitchell. After the death of James Mitchell, Margaret married Joseph Buster in 1975. She inherited six more children, James Delawrence Buster, Lavenia Buster Dalby, Joseph Buster Jr. Lafarrel Buster, Dorethea Bennett

Buster and Ronnie Buster. She had adopted Othella Fowlkes and Katherine Parker as her sisters. Dr. Edward Smith, Elder Earl Blackwell and Martha Wagner of New Zealand were her adopted children. Margaret was the mother of many.
