May 6, 1916 - June 4, 2003

Margaret was born May 6, 1916 to the late Willis and Edna Williams. Three sisters and one brother preceded her in death. She was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from the Paul Lawrence Dunbar High School in 1933. Margaret married the late Joseph Robinson in 1965. Margaret accepted Christ in 1930, joining the Israel Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Reverend James H. Williams. Margaret dedicated her life to Christ and remained active until her final illness. At the time of her death, she was the longest serving member at Israel. A faithful Christian worker, she was a former Brownie Scout leader, a member of the Junior Choir, the Young People’s Choir, the Senior Choir No. 2, the Mass Choir and the Women’s Choir. She was an inaugural member of the Nurses Unit, a Sunday School instructor and Director of the Vacation Bible School for over 30 years and an active participant in the Senior Citizens Ministry. Margaret was a strong believer in education and worked to provide scholarships for the young people of Israel. She encouraged students to get as much education as they could. Aunt Margaret was an avid crafter and often gifted her family and friends with her creations. She is survived by her nephews Harold Ray and Randolph Beverly, their wives Melodye and Sharon; step-daughter Geraldine Smith; great nieces Deborah Ray, Denise Williams, Beatrice Donaldson and Sharon Tinsdale; great-nephews Allen Smith and

Preston Beverly; great-great-niece Kyleigh Patrick; great-great-nephews Seneca Donaldson, Robert Tinsdale, Victor Donaldson, Anthony Tinsdale and Abraham Tinsdale and several generations of Christian students and friends.
