October 31, 1918 - August 25, 2005

Following a lengthy illness, MARGURITE MOODY SAMUELS quietly slipped away to Jesus on Thursday, August 25, 2005, with family members at her bedside. Marguerite known by many as "Margaret," was born on October 31, 1918 in Baltimore, Maryland, one of seven children of the late William and Amanda Moody. She received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. During the year 1934, she met William Samuels, and on April 12, 1938 they were united in Holy Matrimony by the late Rev. Frederick Douglas of Douglas Memorial Community church. William preceded her in death on February 16, 1979. Eleven children were born from this union, the late William A (Butch), Frank Jerry, Maurice and Glenford. The surviving children are Gilbert, Deitra Ringgold, Joyce Brown, Paul, Paulette Cheeks, Thornton and Marguerite Samuels. Marguerite accepted Christ at an early age, joining First Baptist Church at 525 N. Caroline Street, and her strong belief was evident throughout her life. While attending First Baptist she actively attended Sunday school and was a member of the youth choir. She also attended the B.Y.P. U. regularly, at the Sharon Baptist Church, with friends. Her children and grandchildren were her pride and joy, Marguerite looked forward to spending much quality time with her family. She especially enjoyed planning family gatherings and listening to and watching her grandchildren. After all of her children reached a certain age Marguerite returned to the world of work. Her place of employment, from which she retired, was general service Administration of the Social Security in Woodlawn. She was preceded in death
