February 8, 1925 - August 22, 2020

Marie Chery (Louis) was born to the late Armande Delney and G. Louis on February 8, 1925 in Port-Au-Prince Haiti. As an only child, she formed a remarkably close and special bond with her mother Armande. Marie married and later divorced the late Herne Chery.

Marie completed secondary school in Haiti, and later worked for years as a Home Economics educator. In this capacity, she touched the lives of the young women she taught and took pride in their accomplishments. She often reflected and spoke fondly of this period of her life. Her students equally valued their relationship and more than one requested she become the godmother to their kids.

In 1969 Marie made the brave decision to immigrate to the United States, leaving her three children in the care of her mother, while establishing herself so her family could join her.

She worked extremely hard over the course of several years, accepting a variety of jobs in order to support herself and family back home. She eventually had her children and mother join her in the United States. Marie's bond with her mother continued to grow while in the United States, and they lived as an extended family until her mother died at the age of 94. As a single mother in Brooklyn, New York, Marie achieved the difficult task of raising three children to become successful adults.

Marie loved animals and often wished she lived on a farm. She was an extremely talented seamstress who designed and made a stunning wedding gown that Henriette wore at her ceremony. She enjoyed crochet, quilting, embroidery and baking. Marie took great joy traveling with her family, going back to her native land and visiting Henriette and her family wherever the Army sent them.

Marie was a devout Catholic who believed in the power of prayer. She relied on her faith through good and bad times. Marie was a prolific storyteller with an amazing sense of humor and often left others in stitches. She was a devoted employee with exceptional work ethics. A loyal union member, Marie was always ready to fight in support of working folks or disadvantaged people.

Marie deeply loved her family and enjoyed spending time with them, especially during the holidays.

Marie is survived by her children (Lesly, Philippe, and Henriette), her son in law (Kevin) whom she adored, and her grandchildren (Kyle, Ashley, Shelby, and Armanda).

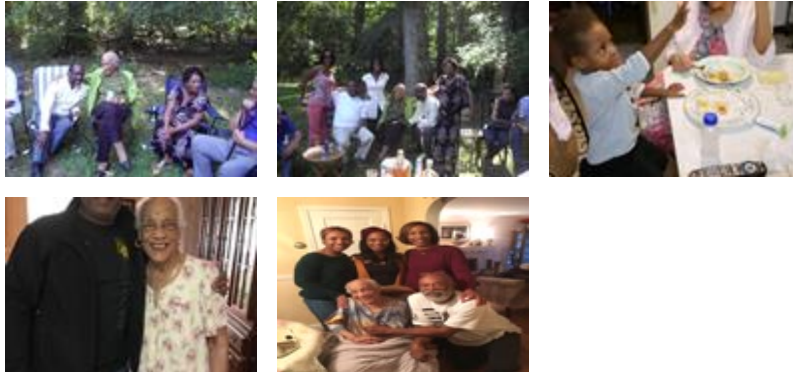
