Marie Elizabeth Hartley, daughter of the late Lonnie and Euther Williams, was born on July 13, 1926 in Goldsboro, NC. She departed this life on October 15, 2016 after a lengthy illness.

She began her Christian walk at Saint Mark Disciples of Christ Church, at a young age.

New Antioch Church under the leadership of Bishop Orlando A. Wilson.

There, Marie chaired the Senior Saints, was ordained a deacon, and when her health was failing, she was appointed Honorary Deacon.
