She was a hard worker and dedicated to whatever she made a commitment to do. She took pride in all that she did and all that she had. Marie adored her children. She spent a great deal of her time with her children, and helping to care for her grandchildren and great grandchildren. She especially enjoyed helping others. She loved to help others, she helped to organize fashion shows, supporting the Waxter Center, she was an active participant in her church, St. Katherine’s. She was an active member of the

Women's Guild, she hosted the church's annual "Stay at Home Tea," assisted with the annual church's Dinner Dance, and a host of other activities, Marie would willingly help out. She also spent lots of her time doing what she loved, exploring the world with her many trips and cruises with her longtime girlfriends. She loved to sew, and was quite the seamstress, making a lot of those beautiful, creative ensembles we often saw her wear and model in some of Flair's Fashion Shows. She loved clothes and had shoes galore. She was known for her stylish dress, creative flair and for speaking her mind. In her later days, she loved to watch old movies and action videos. Those who knew her for her warm and friendly demeanor, her wit and grand sense of humor loved her. She had a very determined spirit and was a warrior "Queen," elegant, strong and loving. In March of 2003, Marie experienced a grave illness that would challenge her in ways that many of us could not imagine. She persevered in many instances, overcoming obstacles and maintaining her faith. But, on July 21, 2004 God decided that enough is enough and carried Marie, a.k.a. "Mumsie" home.
