MARIE SKINNER JOHNSON was born January 1, 1906 in Plum Point, Maryland. She was one of eight children born to Nellie Harrod. When Bill was selected for the Deacon Board at Enon, Marie proudly and eagerly joined the Deaconess Board. A few years later she joined the Open Door Ministry. Bill and Marie were married for sixty and this union was filled with happiness until his death in 1988. Marie was known for culinary skill. She enjoyed preparing special dishes for her husband, family, friends and for many, many church functions. Life to Marie was a blessing from God and she loved both God and life. She was a faithful and contributing member of Enon Baptist Church until

her death. She also loved each one of her family in her own unique manner. She was generous, caring and supportive to their individual needs.
