Marilyn Jean Carroll, daughter of the late Eugene and Rebecca Jean Dunlap, was born in Baltimore, Maryland on December 4, 1954. She departed this life after a brief illness on November 17, 2004. Marilyn received her education in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from Paul Laurence Dunbar High School; after which she drove for Clark's Transportation School Buses, the Mass Transit Administration Mobility Bus. Then moving to California, she became one of the first black females to join the Greyhound Bus Company, which she drove for eleven years. Later moving to Virginia Beach, she worked for the City of Virginia Beach for several years. She then came home to Maryland in 1987 giving her life to God and became a member of the Morning Star Baptist Church. She worked diligently for the City of Baltimore Department of Transportation for fifteen years, where she was loved and respected. She married Marvin Henry Carroll on January 7, 1977 and he was blessed to have "Sug" or "Sugar", his precious gift of thirty-two years. "Mommie" and "Grandma" to us, Aunt Marl" to her nieces and nephews and "Marl" to others, was a very caring and generous person. She would always tell you to do the right thing and with love, put you in your place if necessary- that was just Mommie. She gave her life to Christ and was a member of Morning Star Baptist Church. She was loved by all of her family and will be missed. She leaves to mourn: her husband, Marvin Carroll; two daughters, Tashella McKenzie Allen and Lashella McKenzie Stokely; two sons-in-law, Melvin Allen and Lonzell Stokely; seven granddaughters, Ashlea, Tieaira,
